As SYNNEX grew into a TD SYNNEX global enterprise, countless careers were launched along the way. This spirit of leadership that uplifts entire communities is the lasting TD SYNNEX legacy that has inspired his scholarship program.

Bob and Lily hope to support the next generation of leaders in entrepreneurship, sciences, humanities and the arts. Scholarship recipients will be selected based on academic achievement excellence and leadership qualities as evidenced by their personal statement, letters of reference, and community involvement.

Mr. Huang holds a bachelor's in electrical engineering from Kyushu University, Fukuoka, Japan, a master's in electrical engineering and statistics from the University of Rochester, NY, a master's in management science from the Sloan School of Management at Massachusetts Institute of Technology, and an honorary doctorate degree from Kyushu University. He was elected by Computer Reseller News as one of the 25 most influential executives in computer industries and inducted to CRN's Industry Hall of Fame in November of 2004.

Mr. Huang serves on the Advisory Board of Sloan School of Management at Massachusetts Institute of Technology, is a Kyushu Fellow, and contributed to the founding of Kyushu University Robert T. Huang Entrepreneurship Center (QREC). The Huang Leadership Development Scholarship Fund was established through a generous gift from Bob and Lily Huang. Since 2011, the Huang Leadership Development Scholarship program has awarded more than \$1,000,000 USD to help lessen the impact of rising tuition costs for students who will go on to achieve great things! Scholarship Amount: Up to \$10,000

Number of Awards:

Up to 20 awards based on the availability of funds and number of <u>applications</u>. A combination of new one-time and renewable scholarships will be made; renewable scholarships recipients must meet <u>renewal</u> <u>requirements.</u>

Eligibility Requirements

- Current or past co-worker, or a legal dependent or grandchild of a current or past employee of TD SYNNEX Corporation, or its subsidiaries who left the company in good standing and was employed for a minimum of 3 years at the time of the application deadline and hired before May 11, 2020.
- Demonstrated academic excellence and leadership qualities through activities in school, community or social service activities.
- Accepted into and confirmed intent to enroll OR currently enrolled in a 4-year undergraduate program at one of the nationally ranked top 100 universities or a top 100 nationally ranked liberal arts college as published by U.S. News & World Report. How to Apply

Returning applicants: Greater Horizon's application platform and process has changed, renewal grants are contingent on the student submitting renewal paperwork, maintaining full-time enrollment, a minimum 3.0 GPA, visit the <u>renewal site</u> to read the application instructions carefully. The application window for renewals is May 1, 2023 – June 30, 2023 to allow time for including most recent grades.

To apply to the Huang Leadership Development Scholarship, you will be required to complete an <u>online application</u>. Therefore, we strongly recommend that you start gathering your required documents and begin the application process at least three to four weeks before the May 11th application deadline.

- Step 1 Thoroughly review eligibility requirements, timeline, and required materials information for the 2023 Huang Leadership Development Scholarship..
- Step 2 Gather the supporting documents listed in the Required Supporting Documents section.
- Step 3 your application or the deadline) by using your log-in information Create a account with your current email address. Please note: You will be able to save and return to your application at any time (prior to submitting.
- Step 4 Login to your account with Greater Horizons. Complete the entire application. Do not leave any sections blank. If an item does not apply to you, type N/A.
 - **Employee Information** collects information on your relationship to the employer (employee name, position, dates of employment, and other related questions);
 - Education collects academic related enrollment (current/future enrollment and goals);
 - Extracurricular Activities collects information on activities (school, community or work related) that you have been involved in, and any awards or honors that you may have received;
 - Financial Information collects you and/or your family's financial information.
 - Required Supporting Documents collects all of your required attachments as attachments. All attachments must be uploaded as a Word doc or PDF. Refer to the Required Supporting Documents and Guidelines for the required attachments.

In order for applications to be considered, the online application and attachments must be submitted in English and received by Greater Horizons by 11:59PM (PST) on May 11, 2023.





How to Apply

Required Supporting Documents and Guidelines

In addition to the application form, you are required to submit the following supporting documents to be considered for the Huang Leadership Development Scholarship:

1. Personal Statement

Your personal statement must be 500-850 words and must address the following prompts:

- Describe yourself to the scholarship committee, your short and long-range goals and highlight your academic accomplishments.
- Share with the committee the leadership qualities you feel you possess and describe events or activities in which you have demonstrated excellence in leadership.
- Reflect on your personal journey (significant accomplishments, challenges and/or hardships) and any life lessons, discuss what you have learned from these and how you think it will help you succeed in college and ultimately in your career.

2. Two Letters of Recommendation (PDF)

Your two letters of recommendation must be signed and dated.



- The second letter should be ONE of the following:
 - ✓ A letter regarding your leadership qualities, from a teacher, academic advisor, work or volunteer supervisor
 - ✓ A letter regarding your academic distinction, from a teacher or academic advisor (current college students the advisor should be from your field of study)
 - ✓ A letter regarding your character, from a teacher, academic advisor, or work or volunteer supervisor

In your application, you will be able to provide the name and email address of two people who will upload the letters of reference on your behalf.

- 1. First, include the name and email address of your two recommenders in your application (be sure to ask recommenders before providing their information).
- 2. Then, Greater Horizons will email your recommenders and request that they submit their letters to us directly.

Required Supporting Documents and Guidelines

In addition to the application form, you are required to submit the following supporting documents to be considered for the Huang Leadership Development Scholarship:

3. Official or Unofficial Transcripts of Grades (Submit both PDFs and hard copies)

Current Graduating High School Seniors

Submit an official or unofficial high school transcript(s) AND unofficial or official college transcript(s), if applicable.

Current College Students

Submit official or unofficial college transcript(s) for all college coursework completed AND official or unofficial high school transcript(s).

Note: Any unofficial transcripts submitted will be reviewed for inconsistencies and an official transcript may be requested at any time for confirmation. All submitted transcripts must include: student's full name, student ID number, name of high school or college, all courses and grades, and cumulative GPA.

International Students

Submit official transcripts from your academic institution — both in their original language and in English (if transcripts were not originally issued in English).

Note: Request your transcripts early, as it may take four to six weeks for these to be generated. Ask your school if they generate electronic official transcripts that can be turned into PDFs. Screen shots or Internet-generated transcripts will not be accepted.

4. Employment Verification (PDF)

An employment verification letter from your supervisor is required. The letter must verify your length of employment at TD SYNNEX Corporation or its subsidiaries and must be on official TD SYNNEX corporation or its subsidiaries letterhead.

Current Co-workers or Dependents of Co-workers:

Employment verification from a supervisor is required. Provide a letter for you or your parent's length of employment at TD SYNNEX Corporation or its subsidiaries.

Past Co-workers or Dependents of Past Co-workers:

Provide pay stubs that verify length of employment at TD SYNNEX Corporation or its subsidiaries.

Krish Asknani



Georgia Institute of Technology

Major: Computer Science

Krish is a freshman at the Georgia Institute of Technology studying computer science and is the son of **Dimple Asknani**, **Sr. Data**Analyst at **TD SYNNEX and Hitesh Asknani**, **Sr Data Engineer at TD SYNNEX**. He describes himself as outgoing, compassionate, and determined despite being more introverted in his youth preferring to "manipulate pixels on his computer monitor rather than go to a football game", he shared. "Once I belonged to a community, one that appreciated my electronic endeavors, allowing me to build a social network beyond the world of routers and ethernet cables, my passion for coding was validated."

He expanded his leadership skills in his role as a mentor in the same digital communities that he learned through running programming hackathons to teaching robotic teams, the same crafts that taught him how to be a team player could be shared with others with the same interests at a young age.

It was his experience within the Shooting Stars Foundation that has been the most valuable to him, "It helped me to implement three characteristics in my personal and academic life – flexibility, forethought, and resourcefulness, important for effective event management projects," said Krish. He led three academic programs raising over \$2,500 for underprivileged students and went on to establish a subsidiary that raised \$50,000. This money has been used to provide a higher-level education to underprivileged students across the world, giving them the opportunity to turn their lives around. 

Major: Computer Science

Sumedh is currently studying computer science at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology and is the son of **Jayarama Shenoy**, **VP Technology at Hyve Solutions**. Sumedh has been involved in many organizations but feels his participation in in Lynbrook's Math Club has been the most meaningful. "I've not only met some of my closest friends, but also been exposed to many different aspects of mathematics that I wouldn't have experienced otherwise. As an officer, I've had a great time showing others the interesting aspects of math that got me hooked, while simultaneously developing as a leader learning how to organize teams for competitions, as well as organize the setup of large-scale competitions at Lynbrook," he explained.

As a nine-year-old, Sumedh thought he would be a fantasy writer however, that dream took a backseat to a growing fascination with math and computer science. Instead, writing became a way to decompress, a mental break from working through an intense stack of math problems. These "breaks" would include daydreaming about miniature stories to accompany the problems he had just solved, a brief reprise from translating mathematical formalisms into plain English; like using chickpeas as the main character in the mathematical challenge.

He realized the power that these small, simple stories could have with his Math Club work teaching math concepts to sixth graders which proved successful in achieving greater engagement and understanding.

"Although my dream of becoming a fantasy writer has wavered, my desire to write stories has not," he said. With stories, I can phrase the often-abstract math and computer science that I know in concrete terms, making them available to a wider audience; and I want to continue using them to spice up explanations, lessons, and questions in the future."

Haru is the daughter of Fumi Tsuchiya, Senior Tax Analyst at TD SYNNEX and studying Biochemistry at the University of California in Los Angeles where she is excited to be learning about the process of conducting research and adapting new laboratory skills. "I want to take my time at the university to delve into the world of research, specifically in genetics, which I am currently taking a biotechnology class focusing on yeast genetics," she explained.

In her role as Vice President of the Associated Students of Ohlone College, Haru oversaw the day-to-day activities of each branch under its student administration of more than 30 members. It was through many experiences with Ohlone that Haru learned the value of curiosity. Cindy Zhu



Harvard University

Major: Economics

Memberships: National Honor Society, Interact Club – President, Cal High Model United Nations Club- Director, Mock Trial Team Captain

Cindy attended California High School in San Ramon and is the daughter of **Yipeng Yang**, **Senior Accountant** in California. In the fall she began studying Economics at Harvard University where she hopes to also explore debate organizations on campus where she can enact social change – a topic she is passionate about.

Over the last four years Cindy has achieved many awards including Berkey Model United Nations Outstanding Delegate, 4x Contra Costa County Mock Trial Champions State Finalist – one of 18 schools in the county chosen and selected to be a presenter at UCSB Gritx Talks 2020 (Groundbreaking Research/Innovative Technologies). During her high school internship at the Asian Pacific Islander Outreach organization, she worked with lawyers to research and create educational workshops and assisted in recruiting \$30,000 in grants to organize grassroot advocacy events. "It was through this experience that I discovered that being heard does not mean being acknowledged or even being listened to. Instead, being heard is measured by your effect on the community around you," Cindy shared. This became a new form of expression for her.

Cindy said, "As I continue to examine complex social issues in college and beyond, my ability to build community and leverage collaboration will enable me to create equitable impact". She plans on continuing this research journey by attending law school after she graduates Harvard.





Frequently Asked Questions

Who is eligible to apply?

Applicant must be a current employee OR past employee OR a legal dependent OR a grandchild of a current or past employee of TD SYNNEX Corporation or its subsidiaries who left the company in good standing.

Applicant must be a current employee OR past employee OR a legal dependent OR a grandchild of a current or past employee that worked for TD SYNNEX Corporation or its subsidiaries for a minimum of three years at the time of the application deadline.

Students who can demonstrate academic excellence and leadership qualities through activities in school, community or social service activities.

Applicant must be accepted into and have confirmed the intent to enroll OR be enrolled on a full-time basis in an undergraduate program in a four-year college or university ranked as a top college or university according to the lists provided in the About the Scholarship section.

How much does the scholarship provide?

Up to \$10,000 USD will be granted to help defray the costs of tuition or other education related expenses. Up to 20 scholarships will be awarded each year.

Scholarships are renewable for up to 3 years, provided students maintain full-time enrollment, a minimum 3.0 GPA, continue to show leadership qualities and be actively involved in leadership activities. Visit the <u>renewal page</u> for more information.

Are students outside of the United States eligible for the scholarship?

Students outside of the U.S. who meet the eligibility requirements are eligible to apply; however, students must be planning to attend an eligible school in the U.S., U.K., Canada, China, Japan or India.

Which schools meet the eligibility criteria?

Currently, the scholarship applies to several hundred U.S., Asian schools, and several U.K., Canadian and India colleges/universities.

To see a list of eligible U.S., U.K., China, Canada, Japan, and India schools, visit the "Who is eligible to apply?" section above.

Scholarship payments to educational institutions outside of the U.S. will require additional due diligence. Greater Horizons must verify that the school of attendance is a qualified educational institution under the laws of another country. International institutions unable to satisfy the requirements determined by Greater Horizons will not be considered for participation in the Huang Leadership Development Scholarship.

Who is considered a legal dependent?

Dependent is defined as a child, by birth, marriage, adoption, foster children, siblings, and step-siblings up to the age of 19, or 24 if they are a full-time student relying on a current or past employee, of good standing, for financial support; a child for whom the taxpayer may claim an exemption on his/her income tax return; and if you have provided more than half their support, and they lived with you for more than half the year. Grandchildren are eligible and are not required to be legal dependents.





Frequently Asked Questions

How do I demonstrate leadership to the scholarship committee?

Your personal statement (essay) and the application allow you to describe the various awards and honors, school activities, community involvement, and any other personal achievements that indicate a strong desire to further enrich your life and the lives of others. In addition, the letters of reference should come from community leaders—such as teachers, employers, business owners, and heads of charities—who know you personally and with whom you may have worked.

What kind of Personal Statement/essay do I need to write?

Your personal statement should address all of the prompts (see Required Supporting Documents section) while focusing on your personal goals and your interest in developing yourself as a future leader in an increasingly inter-connected world.

How do I apply?

Candidates must complete the <u>online application</u> and submit all required materials in **English** to be considered for the scholarship.

If I am awarded a scholarship, do I get the check?

No. Should you be awarded, scholarship payments will be sent directly to your college financial aid office after Greater Horizons receives verification of admission and enrollment.

If I receive a scholarship one year, will I automatically receive an award the following year?

No. While the scholarship is renewable for up to three years and can be received for a total of four years, recipients must continue to meet renewal eligibility criteria. Renewable eligibility criteria include:

- Complete mid-year update report
- •Continued growth in college, leadership qualities and be actively involved in leadership activities.
- •Full-time enrollment status at approved school of attendance
- •Minimum cumulative college GPA of 3.0;
- •Complete and submit online Renewal Request Form along with required attachments
